

# Sacred Conversations on Race: UCC East Goshen will set

aside time over the summer to begin sacred conversations on race.

Beginning July 11, Roots & Roofs will look at Institutional Racism and White Supremacy. The United Church of Christ has been encouraging its congregations to take on the awkward, sometimes difficult but entirely essential task of engaging with each other on the subject of Race in America. In 2016, the denomination released a curriculum



called "White Privilege, Let's Talk". Our congregation used the curriculum for a six-week adult study. We'll be revisiting portions of it for the first two weeks and then continuing on to:

*July 25th*: Racial history *August 8th*: Being an Ally

August 1st: Children & Race August 15th: Action steps to be an Ally

Why, "Sacred Conversations"? Our work is rooted in the universal, perfect love of God and the prophetic call to justice and mercy. We hope that in the community God has gathered here in West Chester, each of us can meet and share in mutual respect and love. It is no more or less than our call to build the kingdom of God on earth. As the General Minister and President of the UCC, John Dorhauer, says in the introduction to "White Privilege, Let's Talk", "... the work by whites to understand white privilege is more than the work of justice: it is the work of spiritual healing. ... It is far past time that we admit that and commit not just to the work of justice, but to the work of healing our own spiritual wounds and the wounds of our ancestors."

**Conversations continue**: For any who prefer a stand-alone discussion, we'll also offer "Book Club" discussions on one topic at a time. We'll meet on Zoom for a session where the participants view a video on Race in America and take time to discuss it. The plan is to host early-evening meetings, but please feel free to share suggestions for a time to hold the sessions with the UCCEG office. 

#### **Renomination Process for the Rev. Traci Blackmon**

The United Church of Christ Board of Directors is beginning the renomination process for the Rev. Traci Blackmon as UCC Associate General Minister, and is inviting members of the wider church to offer comments on her leadership.



Rev. Blackmon completes her first four-year term in office on July 20, 2021. Following UCCB Standing Rules, a UCCB Renomination Committee is soliciting feedback on her leadership as part of the renomination process. The Committee is looking for comment from members of the UCCB Executive Committee who have served during Rev. Blackmon's term in office, current members of the Cabinet of Council of Conference Ministers, three UCC seminary presidents, and three ecumenical partners who have worked with Traci. Several former Conference moderators will be included, as well as her fellow national officers and the national staff. Rev. Blackmon will also be called for an interview. That information and feedback, along with the responses collected on UCC.org, will be used by the Renomination Committee to create a report and recommendation that will be presented to the United Church of Christ Board at the fall 2020 meeting.

Individuals who want to participate should view the Blackmon renomination page (<u>https://www.ucc.org/blackmon\_renomination</u>) and use the submission form to comment on Traci's work and leadership during her tenure and as Associate General Minister, Justice and Local Church Ministries. The information will go directly via email to Yvette Wynn, current UCCB Chair, and Chair of the Renomination Committee. The deadline for comments via this web page is September 1, 2020.

The UCCB will vote on Rev. Blackmon's renomination in October. Her nomination would be brought to the 33rd General Synod for consideration for re-election in July 2021.

## "Waking Up White" An Honest Process of Self-reflection

If you missed the first opportunity to participate in the 5 week discussion around the book "Waking Up White", you have another opportunity as a second group is being formed.

What is this? It is an opportunity for white people to begin an honest process of self-reflection. People ask, "What can we do?". If you are not already engaged in anti-racism work/ministry, then this might be a good place for you to start.

It is important for us to be totally transparent with you about what this IS and is NOT. This is an opportunity to risk discomfort. This is not a conversation that will make you feel better. It is not a conversation that will fix things and give you the answers. It will give you the opportunity to discern that for yourself. The "homework" is not to be done by pouring out your learning upon Black people. It is a way to gain insight about what it means for white people to talk with each other and when with Black people, to listen, learn and support from behind.

It is an opportunity for us to continue the conversation and engage in meaningful sharing that will hopefully lead to the next step of becoming people who then engage in anti-racism work.
