

To our members and the community around UCCEG,

After some various conversations, notes and emails about our sign at the front of our church grounds on Route 352 and Green hill road, I want to take this time to share my thoughts about what our Black Lives Matter sign says to me.

The sign at the front of the church speaks to the community who pass by it about our church witness and love. From time to time the church has the opportunity to be specific and direct in our call to justice and love. Hopefully it is a given to the community at large that we as UCCEG people do believe that all lives do matter to God. Although it may not be the case that we (as a society) include those who are often marginalized and forgotten as the "ALL." At this time in the history of our country when prejudice against people of color, particularly Black people, is on the front burner, we have a chance to be bold and specific in our stand of love. All people matter to God, but we have had signs in our entrance saying hate has no home here and on a car in our parking lot, Jesus was an undocumented immigrant. I wear a rainbow stole as a sign of inclusion and welcome of all those who feel their sexuality makes them unlovable to some, but not so here! Our doors and hearts are open, because we believe, all are loved, forgiven, and called beloved children of God. The God we worship, has never seen skin color, ethnicity, sexuality, financial stability, education, or voting party as reasons to not be included in ALL. Sadly enough we don't have to look far into the conversations and actions of humankind to find words of exclusion, prejudice, judgement, stereotypes and "righteous" anger.

Words, even signs will not win the battle for love, but it is a start to be upfront, take a stand for those not treated fairly, and put our hearts out there for all to see. As we speak of justice in places where there is little, this does not mean less justice for me. We have never said JUST black lives matter. But so many places in the world seem to live by the thought all lives "But"... (the immigrant, the

black, the poor, the Trans, the old, the marginalized.) Until they matter without qualifiers, not based on merit or clothing or criminal history or money earned or zip code or education; Until ALL is second nature, and truly do matter, we need to be reminded.

I believe we are surely speaking God's love into a world being torn apart by hate. The question I ask myself on a daily basis is how can I love more? How can I challenge my own subconscious thinking to be more in line with God's?

I pray you may feel this too: proud that we are bold in our Love, no matter who is reading or listening.

If you too are feeling you need to have open and educational moments of discussion on Justice and racism, join in the weekly sacred discussion which Al Benner-Smith is leading. We view a video on race/white privilege/honest reckoning with our inner thinking. Then we share our personal thoughts, fears, learnings, and together begin discussions toward God's sacred call to loving mercy and justice. #### **Update on Finances**



Thank you for your continued contributions to UCC East Goshen and its mission. Although we are not meeting in person for worship and other activities, the church is not closed. We continue to pay our employees and other commitments that help us to serve our members and community.

Income was down in July, as well as year-to-date. We have had no "use of building" income since March. We anticipate the forgiveness of the PPP Loan, which will help to close that gap. Offering was below budget in July, although YTD is on budget. We had some gifts early in the year, which helped that YTD number. Our current concern is how to make up the income normally realized by the Apple Butter Festival. The finance team and council have worked to find alternate ways to continue the spirit of the festival and also attain the monetary goals. Generally, our expenses have been below budget. This, along with your continued support, has helped considerably in allowing us to continue to pay employees and bills in a timely manner.

Thank you for helping to fund the building repairs undertaken during the summer. The repairs to the wall behind the pulpit have been completed, the roof repairs around the steeple will begin soon and the east and north walls of the sanctuary will be power washed. The cell tower company will be paying for the roof repairs around the steeple. Any future building/capital expenses will come from the Capital/Building Fund account with Edward Jones.

Below is a special request from Susan Pagan of the PFLAG Delaware Media Chapter.

Dear Pflag family,

On July 4, my friend, a longtime Media Pflag member, lost her 23 year-old transgender child to suicide. There are no words for the pain and sadness of this loss.

In going through her child's things, my friend discovered that Jess is the name that her child planned to use post-transition. As a way to honor Jess and to show support for her family, I am running the Princeton Virtual Half Marathon at the end of October. This is a fundraiser for HiTOPS, which "works to foster strong & healthy young people of all identities by providing inclusive and youth-informed sex education and LGBTQ+ support for young people throughout New Jersey." I have set up "Team Jess" so that others can join in . There are two ways to participate:

1. You can register to Run or walk 13.1 miles between October 25th and November 8th. This is a virtual event, so you can choose when and where to walk or run .You can complete your 13.1 miles at once or cumulatively during the two weeks.

The registration fee is \$45 and you will receive a race shirt in the mail.

2. You can make a donation to Team Jess through this <u>link</u>.

We are planning to meet at a park near West Chester to do a socially distanced walk so people can log some miles together. If there is interest, I can also set up a time to do a Delaware County walk.

Thanks so much for reading this and considering participating. Pflag has been such a great source of love and support for me and also for my friend. When I asked her about setting up the team she wrote that "I will always be grateful to my PFLAG family who supported me throughout the years."
