"for such a time is this...?"

This morning I asked my Café script participates what were their favorite scriptures/themes from the bible which they held onto as life mantras, helping to unearth God's call in our life. They were insightful, from Matthew 6:25-34 "the lilies of the field which neither toil nor spin, or worry," and Psalm 100: "make a joyful noise, O be glad," and Psalm 23: "the Lord is my Shepard I shall not want," and psalm 62: "He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, I will never be shaken" and Isaiah 41:13: "For I, the LORD your God, will hold your right hand, saying to you, 'Fear not, I will help you. '"

Where do you get comfort? What words do you hold onto from the bible as you find your feet in quicksand? Your heart broken? Your dreams sideswiped? Your plans completely devastated?

During these months of covid, making choices and plans for any parts of life, while uncertainty is lurking around each corner, has taken all the courage we can muster. We have all been called to find our strongest resilience, our better angels, and cling to that which we know is sure, certain, alive and comforting. As we are waiting for some cure for this pandemic, opening to be safe, lower numbers of those infected and more civil conversations, what is God offering to us from ancient sources? Could there be some promise and power in the words which moved our hearts in the past that come to mind when the days are not ordinary or common? Could we have Our Bible "for just a time as this?" That line comes to us from the book in the bible called Esther chapter 4 verse 14.

Author Kristen Brown writes this: "For such a time as this" - the phrase alone invokes courage and hope among believers. From the time we're first introduced to it from the book of Esther, these six simple words inspire us toward that one defining moment we all long for—our chance to make a difference." A moment like Queen Esther's when it didn't seem that she was being called to bring healing, perspective, and energy to a whole people while they were under direst." We can learn how to discover our own "for such a time as this" by reflecting on these words, it involves so much more than one pivotal moment. It also involves trusting God right where we are."

So, what is the Good News you remember from Sunday school, or at a family meal when prayers have been said? What were the first scriptures, statement of faith, or words of liturgy which you remember? What are the refrains God has placed in your heart to keep you going and "fear not" as you have lived since March? Where will your strength come from as we look forward to many more months of caution, distancing, health scares and living in these times?

Don't keep your precious gems of Light and hope to yourself, write them, send them, say them, repeat them, pray them, remember them.

For such a time is this... "We've got this!"

Financial Update

Thank you again for your continued support of UCC East Goshen. It has been a different year, for sure. With our building being closed, we have lost a significant portion of our expected "use of the building" income. Our PPP loan has covered that loss through October and we expect that loan to be forgiven. Offering has leveled off. Our Apple Butter Festival was canceled. This has made October a challenge.

Fortunately, expenses have been below budget. Although some programs have spent little or no money, others have spent more as we moved from inperson to online services. Licensing for music used and a Zoom account for remote meetings are two examples. We have kept current with our OCWM pledge. Major building repairs were paid for from existing funds and recent donations given for that purpose.

We have an exciting online auction coming up November 6-12. We have already raised over \$3,000.00 in cash donations and we have an assortment of items to bid on! 

A Note From Council



In the beginning of 2020, the Council of UCCEG adopted "abundance" as their focus word. Not bounteousness, or gobs, or oodles or prevalence, but abundance.

Abundance mentality says that there is enough for everyone, so someone else's gain is not your loss. Its opposite, scarcity mentality, means there is only a fixed amount of reward, so another's gain <u>is</u> your loss.

In the spiritual context, abundance is less about material gains or losses (after basic needs are met) and instead focuses on appreciation of life in its fullness, joy, and strength of mind, body and soul. This word was chosen to help us focus on all that we have here at UCC East Goshen. To remind us that we have enough to share with each other and those who are not yet part of our circles.

This year has been difficult for most, if not all of us. We have changed the way we work, play, learn, meet, commiserate, comfort and worship, to name just a few. We have less of some things and more of others. Join the Council in our focus of abundance! By sharing, others thrive!

Cooking Applebutter This Fall



Making Applebutter has been a "fun-raiser" for more than twenty years here at UCC East Goshen. it's not safe to have the festival, but by golly, we can have some fun! The week of November 7, we're going

to be making applesauce (which my Pennsylvania Dutch grandma called "snitzing" and cooking twentysome-odd gallons of applebutter the old-fashioned way, over an open fire in the yard out front of church.

How to get in on it:

We'll need 5-8 volunteers on two or three days that week to snitz. It involves cutting the apples, cooking them, cooling the sauce and jarring it til Applebutter day.

We'll definitely snitz on Sunday, November 8 and Monday, the 9th. If we need another day, it'll probably be a weeknight that week, as you're available.

On Saturday, the 14th, we get up early and get the kettle on the fire by 8:00 a.m. This is where the "kibitzing" comes in. (that's PA Dutch for good-natured, perhaps a little funny, socializing) A handful of folks sit around, taking turns stirring the applesauce as it turns a fragrant brown and thickens to a heady, "mmmmm-inducing" delight. In the afternoon, we have to make sure that ten or so folks are around to do the canning. That's a half hour of organized chaos and then the best part: using thick, crusty bread to clean out the kettle. And yes, you eat it.

If you've been involved in the festival over the years but were so busy that you've never stirred, this year's for you! If you're curious about the recipe, we can't wait to see you.
