

"The Interconnectedness of All People With God"

A few weeks ago during Sunday worship, I offered a prayer for Children who know the reality of bombs.

Bombs Kill. Even children know this. At 4 years old our Granddaughter Alaina told me as we sat together," OMA, you Know Bombs are real. My friend at school told me that someone threw a bomb and killed lots of children. Why would someone do that? Why would someone want to kill a child?" What could I answer?

Why would the children who happen to be at the sacred spots in Israel with their families be victims of the Israel-Gaza violence? 63 children killed in May with the youngest 6 months old, and most under 10 years old. What do we believe? What can we say?

The children around us are hearing the news too and they are wondering the question of Why? Why are there bombs and why are they allowed to speak for disagreements, as if their purpose of killing is the answer, when we tell children from a very young age, use your words...? It should make us angry, question, and seek to understand what the adults here are thinking? Are they so careless and have so little concern that any in the way of what 'My Group' believes is not worth living? The conflict seems like it has been going on forever: borders, land, limiting movement, goods, people, export, limited, by one side or the other, and always the deaths....Always the casualties of the innocent, in the way of Bombs, machine guns, and fire artillery.

We might have forgotten as so many have, that even if we don't speak the same language, or worship the same savior, even if our jobs are so diverse, and the homes we live in look entirely different, we are looking in the mirror!

A quote I recall reminds me of this. It comes from the 17th century (1623) but it still rings true...the English poet John Donne, wrote that "no man is an island," comparing people to countries & arguing for the interconnectedness of all people with God.

Any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in mankind; and therefore never send to know for whom the bell tolls; it tolls for thee.

Each death, particularly the death of the children, the innocent, diminish me....because I am part of the whole humanity!

If nothing else, I pray the pandemic has taught us how interconnected we are: The whole globe. When there is not enough vaccination for the poorer countries, when some vaccinated decided it won't hurt them to unmask and take liberty with precautions, when our concern is for our family, our safety, our resources and security, when we know it might hurt another but, I want what I want. then we haven't learned the most valuable lesson which over and over again we are being taught.

Their children are ours, their health is ours, their safety is ours, their deaths do indeed diminish us! Let us pray constantly for each other, all around the globe.


Salvation Army Monthly Dinners

Worship & Music Update



Max Staley, Master of Divinity student, has been coordinating and leading our Roots & Roofs worship services. Council has now approved him to conduct his Field Education core requirement in continuing to work with Roots & Roofs. According to the Lancaster Theological Seminary Guidelines for Field Education their vision is: Where God transforms us to transform others and the world.

Three of the 8 objectives of Field Education at Lancaster Seminary are the following:

"To develop or to deepen the sensitivity, compassion, and discernment needed to minister with people of various cultures, ages, and educational backgrounds."

"To engage students in a wise supervisory process in which they will experience shared ministry, critical reflection, professional competence, and faith development."

"To develop a habit of theological reflection as an integrative force in shaping a life of faith, ministry, and leadership."

This 10 week term, beginning in August 2021, will provide Max with 6-8 hours of work per week. Pastor Angelee Benner-Smith will be his supervisor/mentor.

W & M are glad that Max can take advantage of this opportunity and look forward to our congregation giving him our support in this venture.

Christian Education Needs YOU

I am recruiting people to serve on the Christian Education Committee. This committee is responsible for Sunday school as well as adult education. Meeting times haven't been scheduled yet but will be set up according to YOUR schedule if you are the first to join the committee! You don't need to be a parent, the only requirement is an interest in furthering the spiritual journeys of the members of our congregation.

Finances

Throughout the pandemic our church has been blessed by the generosity of our friends and members. Without much prompting we all seemed to recognize that our church is in an exceedingly difficult time. When we are not meeting in person, it is quite easy to forget that our giving is an essential part of church life. In April, despite our wonderful outdoor Easter service, our pledged giving was well below our budget. Over the past year we have had several our congregants begin to utilize a free service and had their banks send a monthly check directly to the church. That way they never miss a single month. Council and our Growth Committee has arranged giving via Facebook and PayPal to make online giving possible. If you are able, please do your best to keep up with your pledge. Giant Cards

Giant Food cards are now available through the church. If you buy a \$50 Giant card from the church, you get to spend a full \$50 in your favorite Giant Foods store, but Giant pays the church 5%! The best part is that this money maker costs you nothing but could mean a lot to the church. Cards are available in \$25, \$50, and \$100 increments, and the church makes 5% on each! Memorial Gift Policy

Council has established a Memorial Gift Policy to ensure that Memorial funds are available for critical needs of the church as determined by Council. Below is the policy. If you have any questions, please contact Beth Sayler.

Memorial Gift Policy (adopted 5/17/21)

We welcome donations in memory of members and friends. The following are guidelines to aid you in your giving and aid us in our receiving of memorial gifts.

- 1. Families may donate or suggest donations to UCC East Goshen in memory of their loved ones. The use of these funds will be determined by Council.
- 2. The family may suggest a project or item, but Council must approve the receipt of the gifts for that purpose. Council may refuse gifts earmarked for uses they have not approved.
- 3. If no specific fund/use has been requested by the family, all memorial donations will be put into the church's general memorial fund. These monies will be used for special projects or expenses of our church.
- 4. If monetary gifts are given and the family has not requested donations or spoken with a representative regarding memorials, all gifts will be put into the general memorial fund.
- 5. It is the responsibility of the Financial Secretary to generate a letter to each donor acknowledging their donation according to government guidelines and pass on names and addresses of donors to the Pastor by the end of each month, if not before.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the Pastor to generate a letter(s) to the family which will include the name and address of each donor and a total amount in the fund/given.
- 7. These letters will go out in a timely manner, ideally in less than a month following the receipt of the gift.

Financial Corner

Thank you for your continued financial support. Our Easter flower sales netted \$263 and our Walk to Jerusalem brought in \$809! Unfortunately, our envelope giving was \$3,700 below budget in April, and \$2,000 under budget for the first four months. With one more Sunday offering in May at the time of this report, it looks like May's envelope giving will end on budget.

The church received a second PPP loan of \$9477 earlier this year. It was used to pay staff salaries. This loan has helped considerably with cash flow, enabling us to pay all bills in a timely manner. We expect this loan to be forgiven. As soon as they release the forgiveness application, we will complete it.

The financial team has decided to offer Giant gift cards several times a year. You can order in advance, or you can purchase cards when they are offered following an in-person service. We will have cards in \$100 and \$50 denominations. You may make a special request for \$25 denominations. If you order and pay for your cards in advance, please be sure to write "Giant cards" on the memo line of your check. Exciting Things to Come From Roots and Roofs. As we begin moving towards a post-Covid world, it is time to put the lessons we've learned to the test as well as genuinely accept the abundant opportunities provided to us even in dark, difficult times. Over the past year, Roots and Roofs has met continuously via Zoom to not only stay connected but to help one another safely explore and navigate a changing world, keeping the Divine light always in sight. Moving forward, my hope is to expand this community using a hybrid online-in-person model. The potential is that with increased social media engagement and continued Zoom meetings we can not only open our hearts and minds to perspectives from around the world but also take our meetings on the road. This resolution is intended to promote a more perfect union between the UCC's call for justice and G-d's call to act thoughtfully and care for ourselves wholly. 
4th of July Thanks-Giving
