



Celebrate the Legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. "Make it a Day On, Not a Day Off."

St Paul's Baptist Church, in collaboration with the Charles A Melton Center, is holding its 21st annual day of service in honor of Dr King. (All programs described below are from 9-12 noon on Monday 1/20/25 unless otherwise noted.) There are many ways for you to get involved.
