

40,000 people currently are experiencing food insecurity in Chester County. Suggested items to donate are canned meat, canned fish, cereal, peanut butter, non-grape jelly, spaghetti sauce (cans or plastic jars), hearty soups, canned fruit but other non-perishable items are gratefully accepted as well. Also, personal care items including soaps, toothpaste, toilet paper, diapers (sizes 5 and 6), baby wipes, and feminine products. WCFC, at 431 S. Bolmar Street, is adding hours on Thursday evenings from June 19th through August 21st to provide extra food for children over the summer.
